





2.3 <u>Order of precedence</u>. In the event of a conflict between the text of this document and the references cited herein, the text of this document takes precedence. Nothing in this document, however, supersedes applicable laws and regulations unless a specific exemption has been obtained.

#### 3. REQUIREMENTS

\* 3.1 <u>General</u>. The requirements for acquiring the product described herein shall consist of this document and MIL-PRF-19500.

\* 3.2 <u>Qualification</u>. Devices furnished under this specification shall be products that are manufactured by a manufacturer authorized by the qualifying activity for listing on the applicable qualified manufacturer's list (QML) before contract award (see 4.2 and 6.3).

\* 3.3 <u>Abbreviations, symbols, and definitions</u>. Abbreviations, symbols, and definitions used herein shall be as specified in MIL-PRF-19500.

\* 3.4 <u>Interface and physical dimensions</u>. Interface and physical dimensions shall be as specified in MIL-PRF-19500, and on figures 1 (T0-254AA), 2 (die), and 3 (T0-267AB, surface mount) herein. Methods used for electrical isolation of the terminal feedthroughs shall employ materials that contain a minimum of 90 percent AL<sub>2</sub>O<sub>3</sub> (ceramic). Examples of such construction techniques are metallized ceramic eyelets or ceramic walled packages.

\* 3.4.1 <u>Lead formation, material, and finish</u>. Lead material shall be Kovar or Alloy 52; a copper core or plated core is permitted. Lead finish shall be solderable in accordance with MIL-STD-750, MIL-PRF-19500 and herein. Where a choice of finish is desired, it shall be specified in the acquisition document (see 6.2). When lead formation is performed, as a minimum, the vendor shall perform 100 percent hermetic seal in accordance with screen 14 of MIL-PRF-19500 and 100 percent dc testing in accordance with table I, group A, subgroup 2 herein.

\* 3.4.2 Internal construction. Multiple chip construction shall not be permitted.

3.5 Electrostatic discharge protection. The devices covered by this specification require electrostatic protection.

3.5.1 <u>Handling</u>. MOS devices must be handled with certain precautions to avoid damage due to the accumulation of static charge. The following handling procedures shall be followed:

- a. Devices shall be handled on benches with conductive handling devices.
- b. Ground test equipment, tools, and personnel handling devices.
- c. Do not handle devices by the leads.
- d. Store devices in conductive foam or carriers.
- e. Avoid use of plastic, rubber, or silk in MOS areas.
- f. Maintain relative humidity above 50 percent, if practical.
- g. Care shall be exercised, during test and troubleshooting, to apply not more than maximum rated voltage to any lead.
- h. Gate must be terminated to source.  $R \le 100 \text{ k}$ , whenever bias voltage is to be applied drain to source.

\* 3.6 <u>Marking</u>. Marking shall be in accordance with MIL-PRF-19500, except at the option of the manufacturer, the country of origin and/or the manufacturers identification may be omitted from the body of the transistor.

3.7 <u>Electrical performance characteristics</u>. Unless otherwise specified herein, the electrical performance characteristics are as specified in 1.3, 1.4, and table I.






FIGURE 4. Thermal response.



FIGURE 5. Safe operating area.





#### 5. PACKAGING

\* 6.3 <u>Qualification</u>. With respect to products requiring qualification, awards will be made only for products which are, at the time of award of contract, qualified for inclusion in Qualified Manufacturers' List (QML) whether or not such products have actually been so listed by that date. The attention of the contractors is called to these requirements, and manufacturers are urged to arrange to have the products that they propose to offer to the Federal Government tested for qualification in order that they may be eligible to be awarded contracts or orders for the products covered by this specification.
