

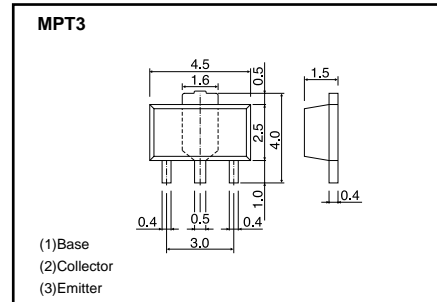
# Medium power transistor (50V, 1A)

## 2SC5053

### ●Features

- 1) Low saturation voltage, typically  $V_{CE(sat)}=0.12V$  at  $I_C/I_B=500mA/50mA$
- 2)  $P_C=2W$  (on  $40\times40\times0.7mm$  ceramic board)
- 3) Complements the 2SA1900

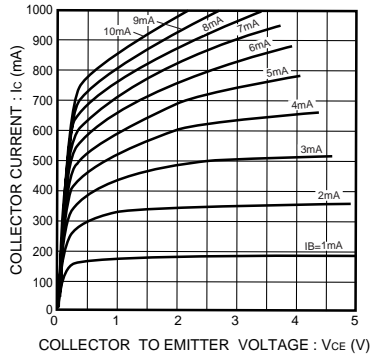


Fig.1 Grounded emitter output characteristics

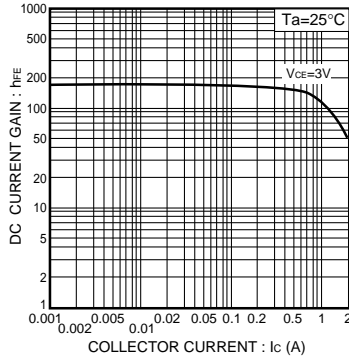


Fig.2 DC current gain vs. collector current

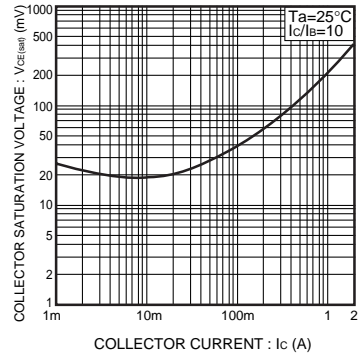


Fig.3 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current

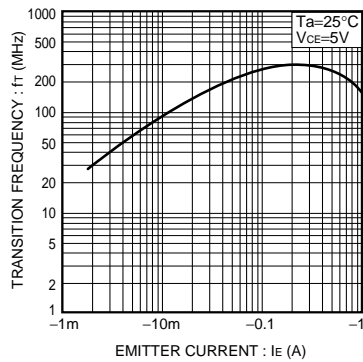


Fig.4 Gain bandwidth product vs. emitter current

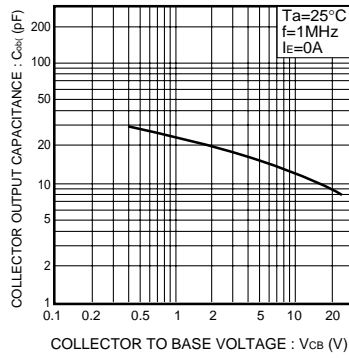


Fig.5 Collector output capacitance vs. collector-base voltage

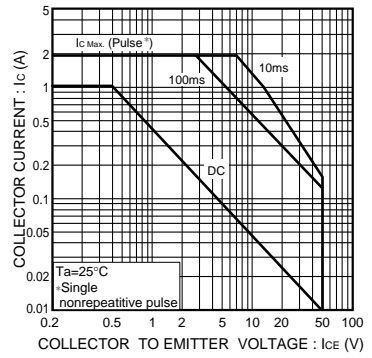


Fig.6 Safe operating area

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
